### **Restart a Heart Day**

#### Lifesaver

After the success of the original Lifesaver app, we've once again teamed up with Production Company, Unit9 and Bafta award winning Director, Martin Percy to create a brand new scenario. One of the major factors cited by bystanders for abstaining from CPR on someone in cardiac arrest is the fear of harming someone and this is also a major factor on why many bystanders don't start CPR early. For every minute that passes after a cardiac arrest, if nothing is done, the chances of that person surviving reduce by 10%. The new Lifesaver scenario will highlight the importance of quick bystander actions as well as reinforcing the point that children and young people can ably do CPR. Watch this space!

#### Letter to CQC – keeping resuscitation drugs locked away

The RC (UK) has become concerned about the stance taken by some CQC Inspectors, who have appeared to require Trusts to store emergency drugs in locked cabinets. Whilst there may be a potential risk of theft of or tampering with unlocked drugs or equipment, such events are believed to be very rare, and if drugs needed in the extreme emergency of a cardiac arrest are locked away, this will cause unacceptable delays in treatment and jeopardise patient safety. ## **Douglas Chamberlain**

Douglas is a retired Cardiologist who worked in Brighton. He holds Honorary Chairs at the Universities of Cardiff (Resuscitation Medicine) and Brighton and Sussex Medical School (Cardiology). He is currently an Honorary Adviser in Cardiology to two major ambulance services in the UK. Douglas was a founder member of the Resuscitation Council (UK). He has a long history and strong links with the Council and we therefore thought that there would be no better person to become our first <a href="Patron">Patron</a>.

### Dr Joyce Yeung - Research update





A Research Grant from the Resuscitation Council (UK) enabled <u>Dr Joyce Yeung</u> and her team to assess the effectiveness of Lifesaver in CPR education on school children as a standalone education tool versus face-to-face traditional instructor-led manikin training or both methods combined.

Our outcome measures focus on CPR skill metrics (compression rate/depth/position) alongside CPR attitude and knowledge of resuscitation and retention.

Three local schools in the West Midlands are participating in the study. The research team has currently visited all three schools twice. The first visit consisted of the initial teaching session to provide CPR training using the app, face-to-face instructor or both. All children prior to and after teaching completed a CPR knowledge and attitudes questionnaire to capture their prior knowledge of CPR. After the teaching, all children underwent a two-minute Chest Compression trial and their CPR skills acquisition was recorded. The second follow-up visit consisted of re-testing the children after two months and the final follow up visit post four months of the initial teaching is scheduled to take place next month.

The results gathered after the initial visit indicates the addition of having Lifesaver training through the app alongside face-to-face traditional instructor-led training provides additional benefits in terms of CPR skill acquisition. We aim for the final results of the study to be published on our website early next year.
